Family of Robert (1824-1895) Stockden

Robert was the third son of George (1800) Stockden and was born in Rangeworthy, Gloucestershire, England and baptised there on 24 February 1825. He married in 1850 Mary Ann Spill and they had a daughter Hannah in 1851. The census for 1851 shows that the family lived at 19 Rangeworthy. This is a one street village even today! Robert's sister Mary (1827) had emigrated to Australia in 1854 on the assisted passage scheme, to work as a domestic servant. I think that she helped to get Robert to Australia for they were both at Ballarat in 1859 when Robert's first son George was born. Robert died at Ballarat in 1895. It is not known where or when Mary Ann died. Their children:

Family of John (1832-1905) Stockden

John was the youngest son of Robert (1789) Stockden. He was born in Gloucestershire. He probably emigrated to Australia about 1855. It is known that he had 'miner's rights' to vote and is on the electoral roll for Ballarat in 1856. This benefit was a result of the miners revolt of 1847, made even more famous as the 1946 film 'Eureka Stockade' starring the Australian actor, 'Chips' Rafferty.

In (probably) 1861 John married Ann Price and they had three children. Ann was the daughter of John Price and Elizabeth (née Godfrey). John eventually became the landlord of 'The Royal Oak' hotel at Clunes, and died there in 1905. It is not known where or when his wife Ann died.

Family of Wyatt Wall (1840-1922) Stockden

Wyatt was born 24 July 1840, in Iron Acton, Gloucestershire, England. He left to get work as a miner in Pontypool, Monmouthshire, where his relatives had gone in earlier years. He married Maria Cleaves in Llanhileth, Monmouthshire on 6 November 1859 and, soon after, daughter Elizabeth Hannah was born on 19 May 1860. On the marriage certificate Wyatt said his father John (1804) was a 'farmer' and Maria's father was a 'contractor'. At this time Wyatt was apparently able to write but Maria and their marriage witnesses were making 'their mark' with the time honoured 'x'.

They then emigrated to Australia in late 1861. According to immigration records they sailed from Plymouth, England 15 November 1861 (There is also a reference to 4 December 1861- it is not totally clear what these dates mean). The records show that Wyatt Stockden, a twenty-one years old married labourer and his twenty-three years old wife accompanied by their one year old daughter Elizabeth Hannah, arrived in Moreton Bay, Queensland, on the ship 'Clifton'. Mr E. Beazley was the ships master.

After working as a miner in New South Wales, Wyatt settled in Gympie, Queensland, a very rich gold mining area founded by James Nash in 1824. Wyatt

made his living in transport using horse and bullock teams. He bought a block of land at Eel Creek near Gympie and lived there until he died. The road at Eel Creek has been named 'Stockden Road'. Maria, Wyatt's wife, died 19 October 1911 aged seventy-three years. Wyatt lived until 1 February 1922, he was then aged eighty-two years. Their children :

[Author's Note:

In 1906 when Wyatt was sixty-six years of age there is in the records for Queensland a reference to the arrival of a 'Miss Stockden' travelling as a second class passenger on the RMS 'Omrah' which left London on 19 October 1906 and arrived in Brisbane on 7 December 1906. Also a Wyatt Stockden, aged forty years, a single male English farmer, travelled as a third class passenger on RMS 'Orontes', which left London on 7 September 1906 and arrived in Brisbane on 22 October 1906. These details are not quite correct. When I researched the original Ships passenger lists I found that Wyatt and Miss Stockden did not board their ships at London, but at Plymouth. Wyatt was given as an 'English Miner aged 60 yrs' and Miss L E Stockden turns out to be Wyatt's youngest daughter Louisa Ethel Stockden. Grandson George Williams Stockden did not know of this visit back to the United Kingdom.]

NB: From a book titled "Winds of Change - 100 years in Widgeeshire" we know that Widgeeshire was conceived in 1879 and South Side State school was opened on 4 July 1910. Pupils included 'Wyatt and William Stockden, sons of a local drayman'. A number of Stockdens have lived there ever since. John Stockden was also in the transport business. He briefly held the contract for the delivery of cream at 2s 1d per 100lb from Glastonbury and 2s 6d from Widgee. After an accident, in which he lost the milk, he lost the contract!.

Family of George Thomas (1859-1937) Stockden

George Thomas was the first born Australian son of Robert (1824). He married Mary Sweeney (1858-1881) in 1880 and their son Robert Thomas was born that year. Sadly, Mary died soon afterwards at Ross Creek, near Ballarat, in probably 1881. George married secondly in 1884, Mary Catherine Kiernan (1866-1936) who was born at Bacchus Marsh, Victoria. They had ten children and yet they became estranged. I believe they were eventually reunited in death when in 1949 he was reburied with Mary Catherine in the Karrakatta Cemetary in West Perth. George lived at Mollewa when he died 12 January 1937 and Mary died 11 March 1936. Mary was the daughter of John Sweeney and Bridget Bentley.

The cortege left Bowra and O'Dea's Private Mortuary, 195 Pier Street, Perth, at 3.30 pm on Wednesday for Karrakatta Roman Catholic Cemetary. Friends were especially invited to follow to the cemetary. George and Mary are now both buried at Karrakatta Cemetary, Perth with their son Sydney, who predeceased them.

The Family of Reuben James (1862-1892) Stockden

Reuben was apparently born at Warrenheip, Victoria, which is a small hamlet east of Ballarat. 'Kryal Castle' can be seen there on the 741m high 'Mount Warrenheip' from the main road from Ballarat to Melbourne. Reuben married Elizabeth Curtain in 1889 in the Ballarat area. I don't know the father(s) of Elizabeth's daughters Elsie Ellen and Nellie. Elizabeth ran a flower shop in Ballarat, until at least 1939 and died in 1940. From the certificate of Elizabeth's daughter Nellie's marriage it would appear that Reuben was more popularly known as 'James'. This family was of the Roman Catholic religion.

Elizabeth Mary (1891) birth cert: 27466 at Sebastopol, married William Tonkin at Sebastopol in 1910. She was twice a patient in Ballarat Hospital, 30 May to 28 Jun 1894 and 10 Aug to 30 Aug 1896. Her mother's occupation was given as a 'laundress'. At that time the family were living at Edward Street, Sebastopol. lizabeth had two more children after the death of her husband:

Elsie Ellen (1895) birth cert: 24224 at Sebastopol, had a daughter Maisie in 1912. In 1913 she married Charles Bale in Victoria State.

Nellie (1900) Nellie was still a schoolgirl when in the Ballarat hospital from 18 July 1910 to 21 August 1910, when the family lived at 117 Hickman Street. She married on 24 May, to Hugh Doherty at the Register Office in Ballarat, Victoria State. The witnesses to the marriage No: 908 were Mrs E Stockden (Mrs Elizabeth Stockden), brides mother and Hugh Doherty, grooms father.(n.f.i.)

Family of John (1863-1933) Stockden

John, born (19 Jun 1863), at Redbank, Queensland, the first son of Wyatt Wall (1840) was named after his grandfather and married Cissy Susan Copp at Gympie, Queensland on 27 February 1902. John died 31 March 1933 aged 74 (sic) years, according to his head-stone inscription. Susan died in 1949. Their children :

Leslie lived in Ungerer Street, Mackay, Queensland and died on 18 June 1981. After a late night house fire destroyed his home he drove through a wall into Mackay harbour. His body was found in the car at 7.30 a.m.

Family of James Cleaves (1871-1940) Stockden

James Cleaves was Wyatt's second son. He married Elizabeth Ann Williams on 15 May 1901 at Gympie, Queensland. He worked for his father, Wyatt Wall, in haulage with horse and bullock teams, later as a self employed timber cutter. When he married he went mining for three years then in March 1904, selected land at Kilkivan, forty miles west of Gympie. Elizabeth Ann, his wife, was ninety-four years of age at the time of her death on 6 December 1970. James died 15 December 1940 aged sixty-nine years.

George Williams (1912-1997) worked at the family home until his father died, by which time he had a little land and money of his own. When the family home was sold George became an auctioneer for six years, then sold out and bought into a hotel until 1950. He made enough money to buy more land and stayed in the grazing business until 1974 when he sold out again and retired. He had made fourteen overseas tours around the world including five trips to England and several around Australia. For many years George rode and showed horses at horse-shows. In recent years he was troubled with chronic arthritis. He remained a bachelor all his life, and died on 18 July 1997. (George kindly supplied the details of his family for this part of the Stockden Family History).

Phyllis Kathleen (1913?-1977) married Jack Connally; both now deceased. She died 25 May 1977.

Family of William Wyatt (1874-1956) Stockden

William Wyatt died aged 82 years on 8 June 1956 and is buried in Gympie Cemetary in the same section as his parents Wyatt Wall and Maria Stockden. His wife, Isabelle died 5 December 1967. They had married on 13 May 1902 and they had a daughter;

Gladys Ellen (1903) b 16 February married Edward John Morrow 1923.

Family of Robert Thomas (1880-1960) Stockden

Robert married Annie Gertrude Chapman at Perth in 1911. When he died on 19 May 1960, he was living in North Perth. He was a city council worker. All their three children were born in Perth. When Robert was a labourer in 1900 aged 19 years and living at Ross Creek; he had a short spell in Ballarat hospital from 28 February 1900 to 10 March 1900.

Family of Reuben James Spill (1885-1961) Stockden

Reuben was always known as 'Curly'. He died on 17 July 1961. As a thirteen years old son of a miner, when the family lived at 73 Ripon Street, Reuben was in Ballarat hospital from 8 July 1898 to 14 July 1898. He later worked for many years as a drayman for the Swan Brewery. In 1913 he married Gertrude Emma Teague. Gertrude died on 22 November 1958 at 18 Wheatcroft Street, Scarborough, W.A.

Gertrude was, I believe, a widow when she married and she had two children who took the name of Stockden. The death notice for Gertrude, in the 'Western Australian', said that she was 'Grandma to Dorothy and Fraser. Great Gran of Kaye'.

Meredith Jack (1900-1964) Jack, as he was known to the family and as 'Uncle Dub' to his grandchildren, died on 23 September 1964. In the obituaries of the 'Western Australian' was a message from their daughter Dorothy and her husband Fraser and grandchildren Kaye and Jan. He married his wife, Nellie (l.n.u.) in 1925. Nellie died on 24 April 1976 at West Leederville, W.A..

Ava G (1910?) known as 'Harvey', married Alfred Harold 'Mannie' Inness at Perth in 1929; marriage ref : No 1929/1419. Ava was probably born about 1910 judging from a photograph shown to us of her and Eileen (1917) Stockden, when Eileen was aged about two years.

Family of George Thomas (1888-1964) Stockden

George was the fourth son of George Thomas (1869) and, obviously, named after him. He was in Ballarat hospital at the age of ten years from 7 November to 20 November 1898 and again from 2 March to 24 April 1899. At this time his father was a miner and the family lived at 73 Ripon Street.

George served in WWI and became an invalid due to this service. He was later severely crippled by arthritis. He married at Perth in 1914, Amy Crawford, before signing up for his

army service. A son, Frederick was born in 1915 and sadly his death, apparently caused by playing with matches in his cot, occurred early in 1919, just before George's return from war service. Amy deserted George, and lived with a man as de facto husband and wife. She had a son and a daughter during this relationship. The man left Amy to bring up the children alone and when she died in 1954 her estate went to George and the daughter went to Perth looking for her Stockden 'relations'. There is a record of a marriage at East Coolgardie in 1922 ref No: East Coolgardie 1922 of an Amy A Stockden. This could be Amy Agnes Crawford/Stockden......

Family of John Joseph (1890-1948) Stockden

John Joseph was born at Sebastopol, Ballarat. His parents moved to Western

Australia and he grew up in mining areas where he himself then worked in various gold-mines. At the Wollewa mine he held the position of shift-boss. He married Elise Russell (1891-1949) at Geraldton in 1917. Elise, or 'Elsie' as she was known to the family, died on 13 June 1949, she was only fifty-eight years old.

On 9 October 1948, John Joseph died at Wooroloo, the hospital for the treatment of tuberculosis. Their home at this time was at 54 Prinsep Street, Norseman, W.A. and his son Raymond John (1923) was at this time working in New Guinea. Their children :

Family of Felix William (1892-1947) Stockden

Felix was George Thomas' fifth son and born at Sebastopol, Victoria State. While he was still a child the family moved to Western Australia. Born in 1892 Felix died 12 August 1947 at Margaret River, W.A.. Felix married Matilda H Maddern in 1916 at Perth (cert No:224). He then also signed up for service in WWI. While he was away his son Stanley Felix was born in 1917. He was deserted by Matilda who left Stanley Felix with her mother. Matilda eventually remarried in Fremantle to Cono Sgro, a wealthy Italian importer, she died at Fremantle in 1967 (cert No: 555/67).

Felix was a private No:3246 in the 10th Light Horse, part of the 26th reinforcements of The 3rd Light Horse Brigade which left Australia for the war on 22 January 1917. They sailed from Fremantle on-board the 'Bulla'. Felix returned to Australia on 17 July 1919. He is mentioned in the book 'Westralian Cavalry at War' written by Lt. Col. A C N Olden, DSO, (probably written about 1921). Felix then had as a partner, Gertrude Winifred Mann, and following the birth of children in 1921(?) and 1926 they married at Perth in 1927; marriage ref No:558/1927. However, on 29 September 1930, at their home in Pingirup, W.A., tragedy struck. The Coroner's report stated that 'Gertrude had fallen whilst performing her household duties and struck her temple on the bedstead, falling forward in such a position as to make breathing impossible, causing death from suffocation while being in an unconscious state. Mr Stockton (sic), who was shearing sheep at the time and was informed by the children that something was wrong, made a search which revealed the tragedy'. Gertrude was a Roman Catholic and was buried the next day in Katanning Cemetary with the authorisation of the Coroner, G E Bevel. Gertrude Winifred was born 1 November 1897 at 6 Malvern Road, Plumstead, London, daughter of Elrick William Mann and his wife Annie Gertrude, formerly Ball. In 1948 Gertrude Winifred was reinterred at Northam, Western Australia.

Robert Stockden, half-brother to Felix, took care of Felix's daughter Phyllis for several years and Felix found help in the form of a child carer for Thomas William and Kathleen Etta who were too small to appreciate what had happened. The carer was Robina Allison McCulloch, born 9 October 1903 or 1904 in Glasgow. Felix and Robina were married in 1931 and two children were born to this marriage. Robina remarried in 1952 reference No: Perth 2216/1952. She died in 1968 or 1969, two weeks after her 65th birthday.

Family of Raymond John (1923-199?) Stockden

I dont know where Raymond John was born. Probably in Western Australia, because his father, like many other Stockdens, was working at various gold mines from the time of his marriage. Raymond John joined the Royal Australian Air Force during WWII. He trained as a pilot and was at one time at Tocumwal, on the Murray River, in

New South Wales. This base trained pilots on 4 engined B-24 'Liberator' bombers and PBY- 4 'Catalina' reconnaissance aircraft.

It was here, at Tocumwal, that he married firstly, Catherine Joan Frauenfelder in 1944. Sadly she died of peritonitis only six weeks after the wedding. Raymond married secondly Ann (l.n.u.) and had two children. Perhaps Raymond's work of piloting charter flights in Malaya and New Guinea caused the marriage to breakdown because there was a divorce. He married thirdly Chieko S (l.n.u.) and had two more children. This part of his family still lives in Perth.

Raymond had an eventful life which included a forced landing in a semi-jungle area from which he survived. He eventually went prospecting in the Calgoorlie area and is believed to have caught pneumonia which was probably the cause of his death. I do not know the date of his death.

He wished his mother a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. He is recorded as being on the NZ Army Reserve. He married Rose Warren in 1913 (no children on record) and lived at Kirwee some 10-15 miles from Christchurch earning his living as a house-painter and he died there in 1966. Rose died in 1973. Both deaths were registered in Christchurch.

Herbert John (Bert) was born 27 August 1878. He emigrated to South Africa in 1901 after his father died in 1900. He had had an offer from a Mr Garland, to be a farm manager at Mooi River in Natal. He served with the British Army during the Second Boer War and was stationed at the Remount Depot at Weston, Mooi River. He was in charge of all the Army farming operations, supplying provisions as well as fodder for the horses. At the end of the war he purchased a farm named "Three Springs' through the government. After he developed it into a going concern he sold it. In 1918, he bought 'Roslin', a lovely big farm which he worked until his retirement, in 1944, to a cottage in the village of Mooi River. He married Ida Victoria Taylor (17 May 1887-1973) at Mooi River 10 September 1907. Both Herbert and Ida died when they were eighty-six years old.

A local newspaper reported on George's death:

"On completion of his schooling George joined the Van Ryn Deep Mine Limited in 1936 as a mill learner and later as a tube mill assistant. He left in June 1938 to work on the Daggafontein Plant as a crusherman. On 30 May 1940 he joined the armed forces and saw active service in North Africa as a Lieutenant in the Natal Carbineers, Botha and Irish Regiments. He was captured at Sidi Rezegh in 1941 and spent the rest of the war as a P.O.W. in Italy and Germany.

Upon his return home to South Africa in 1945 he rejoined Dagga's and at the end of 1949 was transferred to Premier Diamond Mine at Cullinan as foreman. For the next five years he worked his way through the various sections of the treatment plant. In 1954 he was transferred on promotion to Kimberley as a technical assistant plant superintendent then he was promoted to plant superintendent at the Kimberley treatment plant, a position he held until his death.

In all George had thirty-six years service with the Anglo and De Beers groups and will always be remembered for his courage, fortitude and dedication to his work. George enjoyed his golf and at one time was a seven handicap player. He is survived by his wife Kath, (née Whitty), a sister, Blanche and a brother Jack. To them we extend our sincere sympathy."

[NB: In 1945 he visited Gloucestershire in search of his Stockden origins following his release from prison camp. In Olveston he stayed with both the Haskins family and the Stevens family, who at that time had Great Aunt Beattie (1883) staying with them.
