

ODD FINDS in CHESHIRE RECORDS OFFICE

Sometimes a visit to another Records Office proves to be useful even when no direct line is found for the family being researched. In cases where a 'one-name-study' is being applied, references to oddities can be rewarding. In the Cheshire RO I found the following (some were not in the IGI):

LONDON

For St James', Clerkenwell, London

Baptism:

Judith, dau of Experience and Judith Stockden 11 Jul 1689

Thomas, son of Thomas & Sara Stockden 15 Aug 1686

For St Pancras Old Church, London

George, son of John & Sarah Stockden 27 Nov 1782

For Wybunbury, Cheshire:

Jane, dau of John Stockden 01 Jan 1757

Elizabeth, dau of John Stockden of Stapely 19 May 1754

Anne, dau of John Stockden of Shavington 01 Jan 1758

Marriages:

Mary Stockden married James Lightfoot - 07 Oct 1759 (No:123) at Wybunbury Holy Trinity Church.

Banns were called 16,23 and 30 Sep 1759.

James was a widower and Mary a widow. John Moors was the Curate and both could write.

Witnesses were Isaac Wolfe, William Wain and Thomas Hayes.

Burials:

For St Michael, Cornhill, London

Mary Stockden, dau of Robert Stockden, 21 Mar 1715

Thomas Stockden (/don) a vintner, in Fince's Lane, 26 Apr 1646

Mrs Thomas Stockden (/don) wife of the above, 09 Jul 1645.

For Cheshire:

George, inf son of James Stockden of Keoveral (?) 07 Oct 1771

Martha, wife of William Stockden of Chorlton Heath 14 May 1771

Anne, dau of James Stockden of Hentoick & ? 05 Apr 1770 (? date)

John, inf son of John Stockden of Shavington 11 Aug 1767

Elizabeth, dau of Peter Stockden of Saxis Bank, 01 Jul 1764

Anna, dau of the late Thomas Stockden of Shavington 11 Dec 1761

Mary, wife of John Stockden of Shavington 19 Sep 1760

Elizabeth, dau of James Stockden of Stapely, 19 May 1755-

a conflict here of year and the father's names - see baptisms above.

NB: The records for the period of mid-to late 1700's were not the easiest of records to read. Where conflict of names and years appear, regard the reference as a guide only.
